Ray Headon, PEPA Chairman, writes:

Dear Members

Welcome to our first PEPA Newsletter of the New Year. We wish you and your families a very happy and enjoyable 2020.

We have had a lot of changes to the PEPA Committee over the last few years, and our Committee is now down to 12 people. At our AGM last year our President John Pawling announced that for health reasons he could no longer play an active part on the Committee. We are really sorry to lose John after very many years, during which he ably contributed much to the Association. He was our Chairman from 1994 to 2007 and when I took over as Chairman from John, he became our President and has done this for the last 12 years. We are pleased that Gordon McGinty, previously Vice-President, has agreed to be our President, and that Ken Rolaston has taken on the role of Vice-President.

Our 56th Annual Reunion was held at Denbies in October, and 130 members and their guests had a great time. Our thanks go to Tony Slaymaker and his subcommittee for their enthusiasm and hard work. A full report can be found on page 2 and on our website, which also has a 'picture gallery' of the Reunion, many thanks to Paul Brantom for taking the photos. Unfortunately, our Reunion numbers are dwindling and have more than halved in the last 5 years. I am sure there are many reasons for this but if numbers drop below 100 it may not be possible to use Denbies, which has proved to be a very good location. I am pleased to say that we have agreed to proceed with plans for our 57th Annual Reunion later this year.

Philips News

Philips reported sales for the third quarter 2019 of 4.7 Billion euros, with a 6% growth in sales compared with the same quarter in 2018. However, income from operations was 211 million euros, compared to 307 million euros in Q3 2018.

Philips has teamed up with Air Ambulance Kent Surrey Sussex (AAKSS) to bring improvements to its emergency response service. This is the first such collaboration in the UK, and the first time anywhere in the world that a helicopter emergency service will be able to live stream patient medical information to the receiving hospital, enabling better preparation for patient arrival.

PEPA members and guests were directed to the Garden Room where they were greeted with a glass of Denbies bubbly, or non-alcoholic drink. Thoughtfully everyone had received by post their table-numbered raffle card and a name sticker – just in case in the excitement of meeting colleagues they forgot their own name! The Garden Room was lined with seats welcomed by those unable to stand for long. Lists of those attending were displayed in the hall with their work location and table number. The volume and buzz of conversations grew as faces were recognised and memories shared.



As lunchtime approached we were invited by our Master of Ceremonies and Reunion organiser Tony Slaymaker to move upstairs for lunch in the Denbies Suite. Those with walking sticks welcomed the lift. In the dining room there were sixteen tables. Fred Olsen also had a table displaying Cruising Options with representative Zoe Murphy there to help and answer questions. With time to spare members and guests had located their place with their name and meal. Everyone also had a Denbies 10% discount voucher for use in the

shop afterwards. At the far end of the room Denbies had a bar where wines and beers could be purchased. MC Tony called for silence for David Jordan to say grace. Our pre-chosen plated meals were delivered to everyone by charming boys and girls. Seated with colleagues from the same location conversations filled the room. "Do you remember?" and "Who was it that ...?". The lamb, fish or vegetarian meal was accompanied by wine or beer purchased. Those with special dietary needs were served beforehand. Trifles, followed by coffee or tea, completed the meal.

After the Loyal Toast, PEPA Chairman Ray Headon reviewed the last year. At the AGM John Pawling announced he was standing down. Ray showed PEPA's appreciation of John's twelve years of Presidential service by presenting him with a gift, to much applause. Ray announced that Vice President Gordon McGinty has agreed to become President, and that Ken Rolaston has accepted the post of Vice President.

Ray welcomed Fred Olsen representative Zoe Murphy, reminding us that PEPA members were currently receiving a 10% discount on their first cruise and 5% on subsequent bookings – in addition to any current offers. After extolling Fred Olsen's cruises, Ray said under this scheme PEPA had received nearly £6500 since teaming up with them, which is a great help with the costs of the Newsletter. At the moment there are 1159 Newsletters downloaded leaving about 1900 to be posted, at an annual cost of £5100. The membership stands at 3148, sadly nearly 200 fewer than last year. The committee have had several discussions about declining numbers, with the committee itself down to twelve. Numbers at the Reunion have also fallen. In 2014 we had 300 and by 2016 this had halved to 154, while today we are 130. As a consequence of us all aging and Reunion numbers falling it may only be practicable to hold another one or two Reunions. However, our Newsletters and website will continue for some time yet. Ray also gave a special welcome to Beryl Oakley, who sends members Anniversary Cards. A long round of applause followed. Ray ended by asking us to show our appreciation for the PEPA and Reunion Committees, and our Reunion photographer Paul Brantom.



MC Tony started the raffle for the eighteen prizes donated by various members. DABs radio, vacuum cleaners, toaster and kettles, and Joyce Slaymaker's cakes (excellent) and wine were won. Unlike earlier Reunions, none of the prizes were Philips products. Many of you will recall Philips TV, music centres and electric toothbrushes, even a moustache clipper (a favourite with the ladies!) being among

the items won.

Tony then thanked Kelly Walsh, Events Manager of Denbies Wine Estate, and presented her with a cheque on behalf of PEPA, for the Anthony Nolan Trust. She and colleague Jeanette were running a half and a full marathon in three weeks in aid of this charity.



Our MC thanked us for coming and wished us a safe journey home. We parted after another memorable Reunion, which we must find ways to keep going. Maybe more wives and husbands should join us to keep the numbers up?

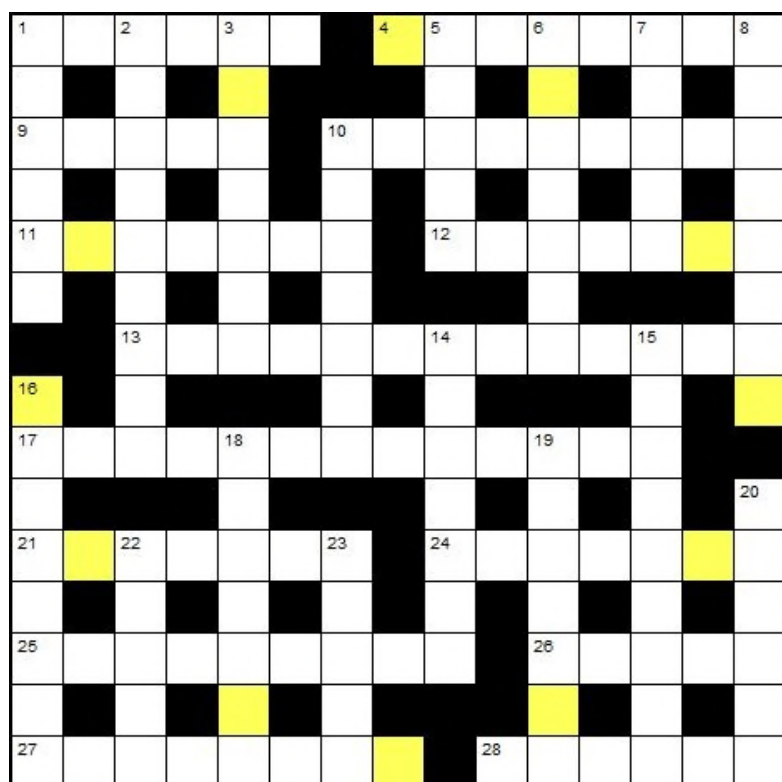

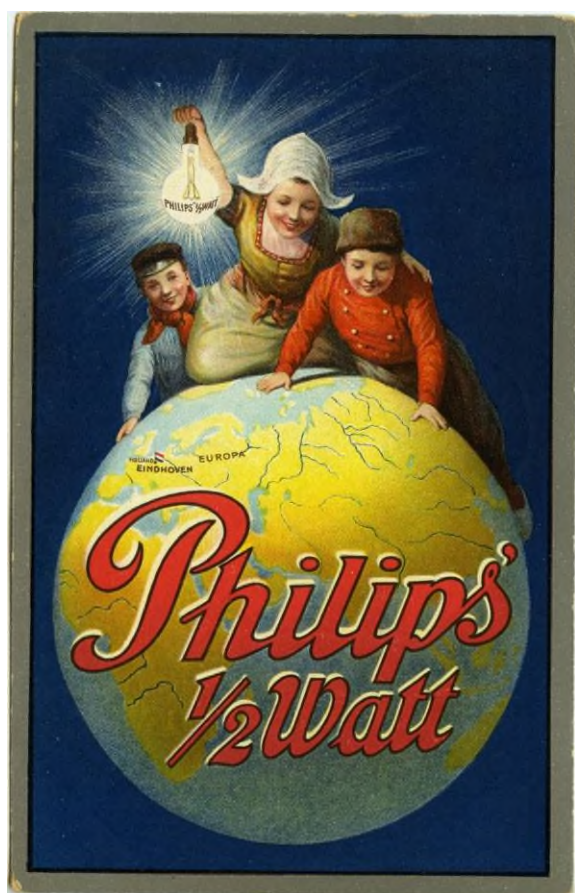

Philips Postcards

David Hyde, who worked for the Application Laboratories in Mitcham, sadly died earlier this year. During his time with Mullard he collected some Philips Postcards. His widow, Margaret, wished that these should go to a Philips Museum as opposed to a private collector. She said that she would like to keep just one of them and this is the blue one displayed here, along with two others, from the total of thirteen. The writing on the back is in Dutch but if you would like to see the translation our Webmaster, Phil Lloyd, has put scanned images of all the postcards on our website. Through a number of contacts I am pleased to report that all the postcards have been sent to the Philips Museum in Emmasingel, Eindhoven. Sergio Derks, Conservator Philips Museum, has thanked us and said that they will exhibit some at the Museum.

The MEL/CWS automated warehouse project

PEPA member Roger Champion has kindly provided us with details of a ground-breaking project he worked on at MEL, Crawley between 1968 and 1973. This was the design and development of a fully automated warehouse and distribution centre for the Co-operative Wholesale Society. The computer-controlled facility handled the weekly stock orders from over 200 CWS shops and was the first fully automated distribution centre in the world, decades ahead of its time.
